

Technology Transfer Licensing Associate

The Technology Transfer Office at the University of Colorado is seeking a Life Sciences Licensing Associate for its Anschutz Medical Campus office.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Undergraduate degree from an accredited institution of higher education, with major studies in Life Sciences related discipline;
- Minimum of one year of professional or post-graduate academic experience;
- Professional experience (1+ years) in identifying, collecting, analyzing, and presenting data; utilizing effective communication skills, both oral and written;
- Professional experience (1-3 years) establishing and maintaining effective working relationships with management, peers, academics, and other professionals, including external agencies, with varied interests and perspectives.
- In depth knowledge and consistent application of research and business ethics.
- Ability to work effectively under general direction or guidelines with minimal supervision or instruction, and in a supportive role to others.

- Professional experience (1-3 years) in a biomedical engineering or medical device organization.

Key Responsibilities: The Licensing Associate has responsibility for the management and administration of a portfolio of intellectual property which involves identifying, soliciting, and evaluating invention disclosures for patent and market potential, prioritizing investments in the portfolio, and negotiating and administering option and license agreements. The Licensing Associate is responsible for using judgment to ensure all transactions meet high quality of professional criteria including all pertinent policies, regulations, and laws associated with the management of intellectual property. The Licensing Associate must have the confidence and interpersonal skills necessary to communicate with very senior, high level faculty.
